Introduction to Medical Terminology

Word roots act as the foundation for most medical terms. They usually, but not always, describe the part of the body that is involved (Figure 1.2). As shown in Table 1.2, some word roots indicate color. TABLE 1.1 Word Part Guidelines † A word root cannot stand alone. A suffix must always be added at the end of the word to complete the term.
