Fraud is both a civil tort and  
criminal wrong. In civil  
litigation, allegations of fraud  
might be based on a  
misrepresentation of fact that  
was either intentional or  
negligent. For a statement to  
be an intentional  
misrepresentation, the person  
who made it must either have  
known the statement was false  
or been reckless as to its truth.  
The speaker must have also  
intended that the person to  
whom the statement was made  
would rely on it.

Rather, fraud would simply describe the method used to break the law or regulation requiring the license. Fraud resembles theft in that both involve some form of illegal taking, but the two should not be confused. Fraud requires an additional element of False Pretenses created to induce a victim to turn over property, services, or money. Theft, by contrast, requires only the unauthorized taking of

another's property with the intent to permanently deprive the other of the property.
